PIZZA LUNCH – FRIDAYS

Pizza Lunch is only available on Fridays for camps (excluding We Be Tripping). This includes 2 slices of pizza (cheese or pepperoni), a nut-free snack, and a juice box. This can be paid for online when registering or to be paid in exact cash on the Monday of camp. No pizza money will be accepted after Wednesday's sign-in.

BUSSING

Bussing will only be used for field trips such as We Be Tripping, Cold Creek Wednesdays, and Tasca Park.

DAY TO DAY INFORMATION

All campers are required to bring their own nut-free snacks, lunch, and drinks (preferably water in a refillable water bottle). Campers are also to wear appropriate camp clothing, closed-toed shoes, and hats.



SPECIAL GUESTS

Special Guests are incorporated into the camps throughout the summer. The King Fire Department will be a special guest at King City Arena, Nobleton Arena, Cold Creek, and Trisan Centre on a rotating basis. This will allow the Fire Department to provide fire safety education.

CAMP PAPERWORK

All required camper information will be asked in the online questionnaire prior to camp registration and saved to the campers' account.

If you answered yes to the allergy or medication question a medication form will need to be completed Monday morning of camp.

If you answered yes to the Inclusion Participant Intake Form question a form will need to be completed and sent to <u>inclusion@king.ca</u>. Please refer to the Inclusion Section in our guide.

Pizza lunches will be on Fridays only, it will be 2 slices of pizza, a snack, and a juice box = 1 quantity. You can either order through your online registration or exact cash on the Monday of Camp.

All forms and any changes to the camper information form must be emailed to camps@king.ca

CAMP REMINDERS

You will receive an email every Thursday prior to the start of camp, with a reminder of registration and notification of any specific camp details for the week.

CAMP SIGN IN/OUT

All camp sign-in/sign-out will take place outdoors in a designated area.

In the event, there is inclement weather we will move sign-in/sign-out to indoors. Parents/ guardians and campers will need to follow and abide by the appropriate signage at each facility. Camp staff will be at each facility to assist.

Parents and guardians are required to sign their camper(s) in and out at the beginning and end of each day at the location they are registered at.

A piece of ID will need to be provided at sign-out **EVERY DAY** and must match a name listed on the authorized pick-up form, only then will the camper be released to the parent or guardian.

WAYS WE'RE STAYING SAFE

The safety of our campers and staff is our top priority. The Township of King Summer Camps will follow all-day camp legislation outlined by York Region and the Ministry of Health. As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to change and evolve, the most up-to-date camp information relating to COVID-19 will be sent to parents/ guardians prior to the start of camp.

CAMP STAFF

All camp staff are certified in Standard First Aid, CPR "C" and HIGH FIVE® Principles of Healthy Child Development and have received a positive Police Vulnerable Sector Check. All staff have attended comprehensive training sessions.

Our camps maintain a 1 staff to 8 campers (1:8) for campers 4-6 years old and 1 staff to 10 campers (1:10) for campers 7 years and older.



PARENTS/GUARDIANS

All parents/guardians are responsible for:

- Discuss camp-appropriate behaviours with their children.
- Ensuring your child is appropriately dressed. All participants must wear weather-appropriate clothing and closed-toe shoes.
- Ensuring that your child brings appropriate weather-related clothing as camps will spend as much time as possible outdoors.
- Ensuring that your child brings nutritious nut-free snacks, lunch, and lots of water. A refillable water container is recommended.
- Label your child's belongings with their full name. This includes two extra face masks that should be kept in a separate brown paper bag, Ziploc bag, etc.
- Ensuring your child does not bring valuable items to camp. The Township of King and its vendors are not responsible for lost or stolen items. Electronic games, iPods, cell phones, money, etc. are not permitted at camp.
- Guaranteeing your child is toilet trained. All campers must be toilet trained and independent in the washroom. If an accident occurs, a phone call to the emergency contact will be made and the guardian is expected to come in to assist in changing. If your child has specific needs, you may speak with the Recreation Coordinator - Camps & Inclusion at 905-833-6563 if you have a concern.
- Reminding frequently wash/sanitize their hands, sneeze, or cough into their elbow, as well as avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth.

CAMPER BEHAVIOUR

The Township of King strives to provide the highest level of safety and enjoyment to all participants and staff during its camps and programs. Coarse language, bullying, non-compliance with protocols, eloping, and aggressive or inappropriate behaviour are not permitted at camp. These behaviours will be documented, reported, and could result in the removal of a participant from camp. If your child has behavioural concerns, please speak to our Camp Directors, and notify them of triggers and methods that are helpful for your child. It is our goal to make camp enjoyable for everyone!

CAMP AGE GUIDELINES

All programs are designed for specific age groups, the child must be that age before the start of the camp. We ask that you respect those ages when registering your child for camp.

Due to the Ministry of Ontario's Childcare and Early Years Act, we are not able to accept campers under the age of four. Your child must be four years old the day they start camp. VOLUNTEERS

The Township of King has a volunteer program (Leaders In Training) for youth looking to transition from campers to potential camp staff, gain experience working with children, and develop their leadership skills. Volunteers are on-site, are not included in the camp ratio, and volunteer their time to provide staff with extra support throughout the day. HIGH FIVE Principles of Healthy Child Development (PHCD) is a requirement to volunteer with Summer Camps. It is included in the training and will be taken in person.

LITs are required to volunteer for 1 week, are guaranteed 2 weeks, and can volunteer up to a maximum of 3 weeks. LITs must complete the PHCD training and be 14 years of age by July 2, 2023.

If interested in our volunteer program, please register for a 1-day training during July 2-5 through Xplor Recreation. Volunteer paperwork will be sent out to participants in May 2024.

ABSENCE

If your child will be absent from a day of camp, please call 905-833-5321 and email <u>camps@king.</u> <u>ca</u>. If you get a voicemail, please leave your name, phone number, your child's first and last name, and the camp they are attending. We will be sure to get the information to the proper camp.

INCLUSION SERVICES

CAMPERS WELL-BEING

Parents/guardians should be aware that the Family and Child Services Act requires any suspicion or allegation of child abuse to be reported immediately to the Children's Aid Society. The Act recognizes that each of us has a responsibility to the welfare of children. It clearly states any member of the public, including professionals who work with children, has the obligation to promptly report to the Children's Aid Society.

NUT AWARE

The Township of King Community Services Department has adopted a "Nut Aware" policy for all camps and programs. Participants are not permitted to bring food products that may contain nuts or traces of nuts to a Town program or camp. Should items that contain nuts be found, the product will be removed from the camp area and returned to the parent/guardian at the end of the day. Soy butter also known as "Wow Butter" is not permitted unless the sticker is displayed.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

All camps will continue during inclement weather and cold alerts; however, activities may be modified to low-energy and additional breaks added when necessary. All camps have a designated area inside each facility. Please dress your camper appropriately for the weather.

LATE FEE

A \$6 late fee per child will apply for every fifteen minutes that your child has not been signed out once flex pick-up has ended. All camps end at 4 p.m. and flex pick-up is until 5 pm.

REFUNDS & TRANSFERS

Requests for changes and transfers will only be considered with a completed refund/transfer form and will only be accepted three business days prior to the start of the program. Changes and transfers are conditional on class and space availability in the program. Notice can be forwarded to <u>camps@king.ca</u> Transfers cannot take place once camps have started.

A refund request form must be completed and sent to the Recreation Coordinator – Camps and Inclusion for approval. A refund request form can be requested by emailing <u>camps@king.ca</u>. No daily refunds will be granted for weekly camp registrations. Processing refunds can take up to 8 weeks. See the chart below for more information.

2. Families are required to complete an Inclusion Participant Intake Form and provide an IEP and Safety Plan to help camp staff with any program adaptations. When considering a recreation experience, please consider the individual's needs, and that the recreationintegrated setting may not be suitable for all persons. Health and Safety of participants and staff is paramount, which could result in participants being denied access to the program.

Please inquire by April 1, 2024, if you need additional support in Summer Camps.

How do I register?

- 1. Look through the Summer Camps Guide and select a camp that matches the participant's interests and abilities.
- 2. Complete the Inclusion Participant Intake Form in its entirety (digital form in the questionnaire)
- 3. Contact Inclusion Services at <u>inclusion@king.ca</u> or **905-833-6563** with the complete Inclusion Participant Intake Form and the weeks you are requesting for Summer Camps
- 4. Recreation Coordinator Camps and Inclusion will confirm the weeks for the 1:1 support.
 - Please note: if the Recreation Coordinator didn't confirm the weeks, then it is still pending on availability of staff.

ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I know if I need additional support is required in Summer Camps/Recreation Programs?

- Extra support is required at school.
- Additional support or assistance is required at home for basic personal care needs such as eating, dressing, or toileting.
- An exceptionality exists that affects mobility, communication, comprehension, social interaction, and/or behaviour.
- The child is currently diagnosed with a disability.
- The participant requires support participating independently in a group setting.

Are staff available to provide support?

- Yes, in most cases arrangements for one-on-one support can be made. The Township of King attempts to accommodate requests for additional support for children with special needs.
- However, due to the number of requests or level of care required, support cannot be guaranteed.
- Please Note: We may ask that an individual be paired with a support person if we deem it necessary, considering provincial regulations and the Township of King's own policies.

EXTERNAL SUPPORT WORKERS

The Township will make every effort to pair participants with Inclusion Counsellors however, families are welcome to hire their own support workers to support the participant in the program if:

- 1. The family believes the participant will be the most successful in the program with their support worker.
- 2. There are no Inclusion Counsellors available for the week or session of the program.




