## King offering two cooling centres during heat wave

With an extreme heat wave set to hit Ontario over the long weekend, King is offering residents two locations where they can go to keep cool: the Trisan Centre in Schomberg and the Dr. William Lacey Community Centre in Nobleton.

Beginning today and continuing through the weekend, daytime highs are expected to reach the low to mid-thirties with humidex values into the mid-forties. Overnight low temperatures will only fall to the low to mid-twenties, providing little or no relief from the heat.

The Trisan Centre and Dr. William Lacey Community Centre will be open the following hours:

Sunday 11 am – 5 pm

Monday 12 pm – 9 pm

During the Canada Day long weekend, you can also visit one of King Township's three splash pads in Nobleton (49 Parkheights Trail), Schomberg (21 Summit Ridge) and King City (25 Doctors Lane).
