
UPDATE:

Air quality testing by provincial officials confirms no threats to public safety.

Highway 9 and Highway 27 have been reopened.

Proctor Road and Dillane Drive remain closed to traffic in support of Emergency responders who continue to address hot spots at the scene.

Businesses within the Schomberg business park can reopen and resume normal operations effective immediately except for those businesses located on Proctor Road, Dillane Drive and Magnum Drive,



The Township will continue to monitor the situation and provide further updates as they become available.

PREVIOUS INFORMATION:

- Fire personnel responded to a structure fire at 71 Proctor Road this morning at 5:20am. The site houses hazardous materials.
- Crews are onsite dealing with the situation. There are no current concerns for the residents or businesses in the area. Out of precaution several adjacent business areas have been evacuated.
