SCHOMBERG- ONTARIO

UPDATE:

Air quality testing by provincial officials confirms no threats to public safety. Most roads have been reopened including Highway 9 and Highway 27.

A portion of Proctor Road and Dillane Drive adjacent to the site remain closed in support of Emergency responders who continue to address hot spots at the scene.

Businesses within the Schomberg business park can reopen and resume normal operations effective immediately except for those businesses located directly adjacent to the site, The Trisan Centre will resume normal operations Tuesday morning.



The Township will continue to monitor the situation and provide further updates as they become available.

PREVIOUS INFORMATION:

- Fire personnel responded to a structure fire at 71 Proctor Road this morning at 5:20am. The site houses hazardous materials.
- Crews are onsite dealing with the situation. There are no current concerns for the residents or businesses in the area. Out of precaution several business areas were evacuated.
- The Trisan Centre was closed Monday.
