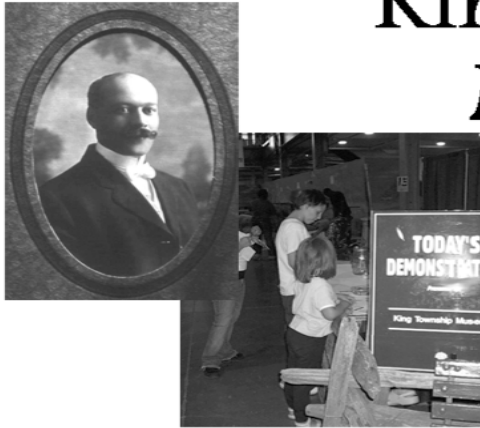


Culture and Community

In 1978 the school was purchased by the Township of King and placed under the care of the King Township Historical Society.
