Reporting to the Supervisor, Environmental Outreach & Sustainability, the Seasonal Environmental Field Labourer is responsible for the following:

- Assist in facilitating Community Tree Planting events led by planting partners by conducting site preparation, mowing, planting native trees and shrubs and pursuing ongoing maintenance of the restoration areas.
- Conduct Tree Planting demonstrations to volunteers of all ages and act as the liaison between planting partnership staff and community members.
- Assist with providing guidance and training to planting volunteers during Community Planting events, ensuring work is completed in a safe and efficient manner.
- Assist with the day-to-day maintenance and operation of Township parks and parks facilities including trails, turf areas, landscaped areas, and park fixtures.
- Provide general labour support for a range of naturalization restoration service projects by performing duties such as mowing, invasive species removal, mulching, weeding, and trimming.
- Perform weekly watering to trees, shrubs, and wildflowers at new and existing restoration sites throughout the Township.
- Operate grass, trimming, and water truck equipment when required.
- Conduct inventory of plant material and confidently identify species ordered.
- Assist in the set-up, tear down and clean-up of all planting equipment and supplies.
- Ensure health and safety/departmental policies and procedures as applicable to Community Services are followed.
- Staff will follow and practice the HIGH FIVE – Principles of Healthy Child Development (Participation, Play, Mastery, Friends, and Caring Adult).
Perform other related duties as required.

The successful applicant will possess:

- Completed or currently pursuing a diploma or degree in environmental conservation, environmental management, horticulture, environmental studies, or a related field of study.
- Previous parks, equipment, horticultural or landscaping experience would be considered an asset.
- Plant and tree identification skills and knowledge relating to ecosystem management considered an asset.
- A team player with excellent interpersonal skills and the ability to coordinate with other departmental staff.
- Must possess a full "G" Driver's License in good standing and provide a current driver's abstract upon commencing employment.
- Valid Standard First Aid & CPR-C, WHMIS, and High Five Principles of Healthy Child Development (PHCD) required.
- Required to submit a vulnerable sector screening.
- Working knowledge of the Occupational Health and Safety Act.
