CAMP PAPERWORK

All required camper information will be asked in the online questionnaire prior to camp registration and saved to the campers' account.

If you answered yes to the allergy or medication question a medication form will need to be completed. (See forms section in appendix)

If you answered yes to the "Does your child have a disability or unique ability that would require 1:1 support (staff:child)?" question, then a Participant Intake Form will need to be completed. (See forms section in appendix)

Pizza lunches will be on Fridays only, it will be 2 slices of pizza, a snack, and a juice box = 1 quantity. You can either order through your online registration or pay with cash on the Monday of Camp each week.

All forms and any changes to the camper information form must be emailed to camps@king.ca

CAMP REMINDERS

You will receive a phone call from the Camp Program Coordinators and an email every Friday prior to the start of camp, with a reminder of registration and notification of any specific camp details for the week.

CAMP SIGN-IN/OUT

All camp sign-in/sign-out will take place outdoors in a designated area.

In the event, there is inclement weather we will move sign-in/sign-out to indoors. Parents/guardians and campers will need to follow and abide by the appropriate signage at each facility. Camp staff will be at each facility to assist.

Parents and guardians are required to sign their camper(s) in and out at the beginning and end of each day at the location they are registered at.

A piece of ID will need to be provided at sign-out **EVERY DAY** and must match a name listed on the authorized pick-up form, only then will the camper be released to the parent or guardian.

WAYS WE'RE STAYING SAFE

The safety of our campers and staff is our top priority. The Township of King Summer Camps will follow all-day camp legislation outlined by York Region and the Ministry of Health. As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to change and evolve, the most up-to-date camp information relating to COVID-19 will be sent to parents/guardians prior to the start of camp.

To further protect campers & staff from the risks of COVID-19, we will be implementing the following safety protocols this summer that align with the release of the guidelines by the Provincial Government:

Face Coverings: Face coverings are not mandatory, however, if you feel more comfortable wearing one you are more than welcome to. When in contact with potential exposure, camp staff will be wearing PPE for their health and safety and when looking after the participant.

Training for Staff: Camp staff will receive extra health and safety training regarding COVID-19.

Increased Disinfection: More frequent cleaning and disinfecting of program spaces, washrooms, and high touch points.

Increased Hand Washing: Campers will have regular hand washing breaks throughout the day and will always have hand sanitizer available to them.

Outdoor Play: Camps will be going outside as much as possible to limit the spread of germs.

CAMP STAFF

All camp staff are certified in Standard First Aid, CPR "C" and HIGH FIVE® Principles of Healthy Child Development and have received a positive Police Vulnerable Sector Check. All staff has attended comprehensive training sessions. Our camps maintain 1 staff to 8 campers (1:8) for campers 4-6 years old and 1 staff to 10 campers (1:10) for campers 7 years and older.

PARENTS/ GUARDIANS

All parents/guardians are responsible for:

- Discussing camp-appropriate behaviours with their children.
- Ensuring your child is appropriately dressed. All participants must wear weather-appropriate clothing and closed-toe shoes.
- Ensuring that your child brings an extra change of clothes as camps will spend as much time as possible outdoors.
- Ensuring that your child brings nutritious nut-free snacks, lunch, and lots of water. A refillable water container is recommended.
- Label your child's belongings with their full name. This includes two extra face masks that should be kept in a separate brown paper bag, Ziploc bag, etc.
- Ensuring your child does not bring valuable items to camp. The Township of King and its vendors are not responsible for lost or stolen items. Electronic games, iPods, cell phones, money, etc. are not permitted at camp.
- Guaranteeing your child is toilet trained. All campers must be toilet trained and independent in the washroom. If an accident occurs, a phone call to the emergency contact will be made and the guardian is expected to come in to assist in changing. If your child has specific needs or if you have a concern, you may speak with the Recreation Coordinator - Camps and Inclusion at 905-833-5321 ext. 6563.
- Reminding your child to frequently wash/sanitize their hands, sneeze, or cough into their elbow, as well as avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth.

CAMP AGE GUIDELINES

All programs are designed for specific age groups. We ask that you respect those ages when registering your child for camp.

Due to the Ministry of Ontario's Child Care and Early Years Act, we are not able to accept campers under the age of four. Your child must be four years old the day they start camp. VOLUNTEERS

The Township of King has a volunteer program (Leaders In Training) for youth looking to transition from campers to potential camp staff, gain experience working with children and develop their leadership skills. Volunteers are on-site are not included in the camp ratio and volunteer their time to provide staff with extra support throughout the day. HIGH FIVE Principles of Healthy Child Development (PHCD) is a requirement to volunteer with Summer Camps. It is included in the training and will be taken either virtually or in person.

LITs are required to volunteer for 1 week, are guaranteed 2 weeks, and can volunteer up to a maximum of 3 weeks. LITs must complete the PHCD training and be 14 years of age by July 4, 2023.

If interested in our volunteer program, please register for a 1-day training during July 4-8 through Xplor Recreation. Volunteer paperwork will be sent out to participants in May 2023.

ABSENCE

If your child will be absent from a day of camp please call 905-833-5321, ext. 6563. If you get a voicemail, please leave your name, phone number, your child's first and last name and the camp they are attending. We will be sure to get the information to the proper camp.

CAMPER BEHAVIOUR

The Township of King strives to provide the highest level of safety and enjoyment to all participants and staff during its camps and programs. Coarse language, bullying, non-compliance with COVID-19 protocols, and aggressive or inappropriate behaviour are not permitted at camp. These behaviours will be documented, reported, and could result in the removal of a participant from camp. If your child has behavioural concerns, please speak to our Camp Directors at 905-833-5321 ext. 6563 and notify them of triggers and methods that are helpful for your child. It is our goal to make camp enjoyable for everyone!

INCLUSION SERVICES

The Township of King is committed to making our recreation programs accessible and supportive to individuals of all abilities. The Township is pleased to offer several inclusive services to better support the community's needs.

One-to-one staff can be provided for those that are eligible. We also encourage the involvement of support workers provided by families or other agencies for those with additional needs. Spaces are limited, so please book early to avoid disappointment. Please contact the Recreation Coordinator - Camps and Inclusion at 905-833-5321 ext. 6563

CAMPERS WELL-BEING

Parents/guardians should be aware that the Family and Child Services Act requires any suspicion or allegation of child abuse to be reported immediately to the Children's Aid Society. The Act recognizes that each of us has a responsibility to the welfare of children. It clearly states any member of the public, including professionals who work with children, has the obligation to promptly report to the Children's Aid Society if deemed necessary.

NUT AWARE

The Township of King Community Services Department has adopted a “Nut Aware” policy for all camps and programs. Participants are not permitted to bring food products that may contain nuts or traces of nuts to a Town program or camp. Should items that contain nuts be found, the product will be removed from the camp area and returned to the parent/guardian at the end of the day. Soy butter, also known as “Wow Butter”, is not permitted.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

All camps will continue during inclement weather and heat alerts; however, activities may be modified to low energy and additional breaks added when necessary. All camps have a designated area inside each facility. Please dress your camper appropriately for the weather.

LATE FEE

A \$6 late fee per child will apply for every fifteen minutes that your child has not been signed out once flex pick-up has ended. All camps end at 4 p.m. and flex pick-up is until 5 pm.

REFUNDS & TRANSFERS

Requests for changes and transfers will only be considered with a completed refund/transfer form and will only be accepted three business days prior to the start of the program. Changes and transfers are conditional on class and space availability in the program. Notice can be forwarded to camps@king.ca Transfers cannot take place once camps have started.

A refund request form must be completed and sent to the Recreation Coordinator – Camps and Inclusion for approval. A refund request form can be requested by emailing camps@king.ca. No daily refunds will be granted for weekly camp registrations. Processing refunds can take up to 8 weeks. See the chart below for more information:

Inclusion Needs

The Township of King is committed to making our recreation programs accessible and supportive to individuals of

all abilities. The Township is pleased to offer a number of inclusive services to better support the community's needs.

Inclusion Support Staff for participants that require additional support within camps and programs. Extra support staff services are provided free of charge to Township of King Residents. *Please understand that the Township will do its best to pair participants with Inclusion staff; however, there are a limited number of Inclusion Staff. Please inquire three (3) weeks prior to the start of the program to ensure availability. For Summer Camp programs, please inquire by May 1st.

Additional Resources

The Township of King is affiliated with both the PLAY and Summer Camp subsidy programs. If families wish to seek more avenues to receive funding for 1:1 support, they are welcome to contact York Region's Access York at 1-877-464-9675 (Press 5 for Summer Camp and 6 for PLAY) to be approved for funding.

Families are required to complete a Participant Intake Form and School Safety Plan to help camp staff with any program adaptations. When considering a recreation experience, please consider the individual's needs, and that the recreation-integrated setting may not be suitable for all persons. The health and Safety of participants and staff is our top priority, which could result in participants being denied access to the program.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I know if additional support is required in Summer Camps/Recreation Programs?

- Extra support is required at school
- Additional support or assistance is required at home for basic personal care needs such as eating, dressing, or toileting
- An exceptionality that exists that affects mobility, communication, comprehension, social interaction, and/or behaviour
- The child is currently diagnosed with a disability
- The participant requires support participating independently in a group setting

Are staff available to provide support?

Yes, in most cases arrangements for one-on-one support can be made. The Township of King attempts to accommodate requests for additional support for children with special needs. However, due to the number of requests or level of care required, support cannot be guaranteed.

How do I register?

1. Look through the Summer Camps Guide and select a camp that matches the participant's interests and abilities
2. Complete the Participant Intake Form in its entirety and send School Safety Plan
3. Contact Inclusion Services at inclusion@king.ca or 905-833-6563 with the complete Participant Intake Form and the weeks you are requesting for Summer Camps
4. Take part in the optional Meet and Greet with your Inclusion Counsellor/Camp Directors

External Support Workers

The Township will make every effort to pair participants with Inclusion Counsellors however, families are welcome to hire their own support workers to support the participant in the program if:

1. The family believes the participant will be the most successful in the program with their support worker
2. There are no Inclusion Counsellors available for the week or session of the program

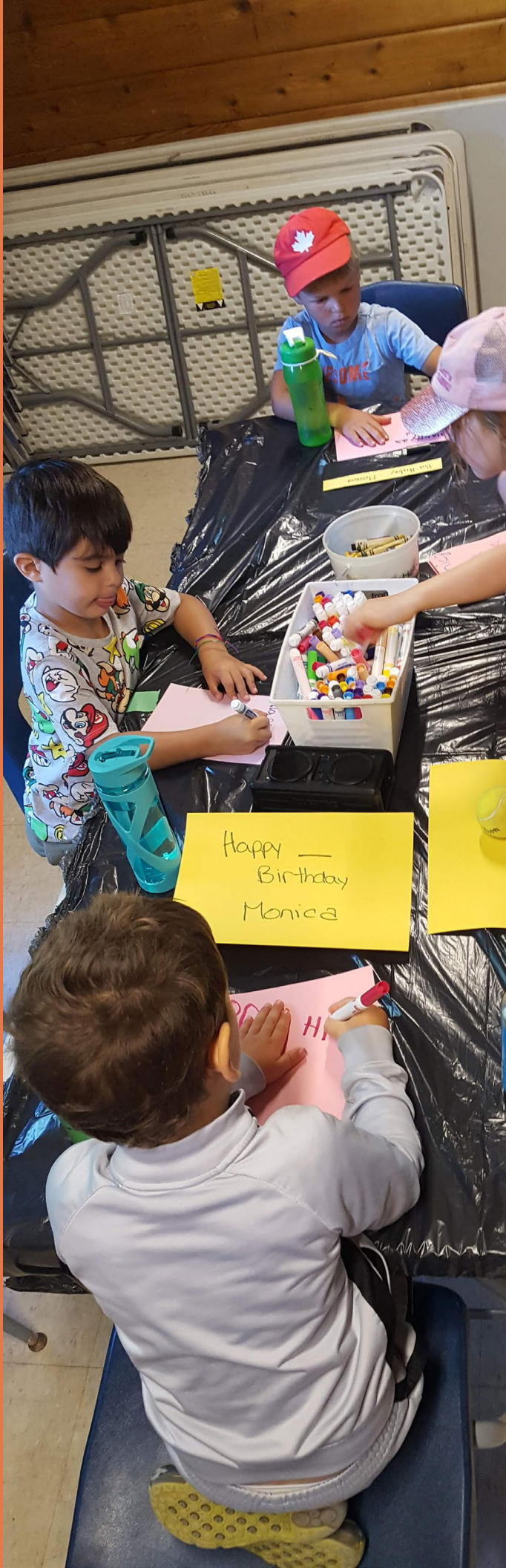
