King approves 2022 water/wastewater rates

King Township Council approved the 2022 water and wastewater rates at its Jan. 10, 2022, meeting.

Under a blended total rate of 3.21 per cent for water and wastewater services, the average annual increase will be \$58.57 for 2022 based on the average annual consumption of 270 cubic metres per year. King's water rates are tiered in terms of consumption to encourage water conservation and the majority of King homeowners are in the lowest tier.

As was offered last year, to assist homeowners who have been financially impacted by COVID-19, eligible property owners are once again able to spread payment of a quarterly water bill over a threemonth period with no interest in 2022. To qualify, the property owner must contact the Township Finance Department to make a formal request <u>prior to the due date</u>. For more details see www.king.ca/waterrates.

Municipalities are required by the Sustainable Water and Sewage Act (2002) to recover the full cost of providing water services to the public.

York Region is responsible for bulk water supply and transmission, as well as wastewater treatment and trunk sewer conveyance systems. The Township is responsible for operation and maintenance of the local water distribution and sewage collection systems in King City, Nobleton, Schomberg and Ansnorveldt.

The Township's water rate consists of fixed and variable components: a base rate to cover fixed costs and a variable rate based on water consumption.
